NSW Government invests \$66,000 in upgrades for Hawkesbury District Health Service

Patients and visitors to the Community Health Centre in the Hawkesbury will get a cool change this summer with new air conditioning, thanks to extra funding from the NSW State Government.

Member for Hawkesbury, Robyn Preston MP, said the NSW Government was investing \$66,000 to upgrade the systems at the Community Health Centre in Windsor, which is part of the Hawkesbury District Health Service.

“This is a fantastic improvement for the facility and will provide a more comfortable environment for staff and patients, which include newborn babies and elderly patients recovering after injury or illness,” Ms Preston said.

The Hawkesbury District Health Service includes a 131-bed teaching hospital providing emergency services for adults and children, as well as community and allied health services for the local Windsor community.

The service is operated by St John of God Health Care, and provides public patient services under a public-private partnership with the Nepean Blue Mountains Local Health District.

Hawkesbury District Health Service Chief Executive Officer Strephon Billingham welcomed the upgrade.

“It is wonderful to know that as we go into the hotter months of summer that our patients and staff will have a cool and comfortable hospital, no matter the temperature outside.”
