FUNDING ANNOUNCED - 2019 COMMUNITY BUILDING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

The electorate of Hawkesbury has today secured \$300,000 in funding for a total of thirteen projects through the NSW Government's 2019 Community Building Partnership Program.

Member for Hawkesbury Robyn Preston MP said the State Government funds will deliver much-needed improvements to local facilities including new public toilets in Bona Vista Park, erection of new safety barriers at Glenorie Memorial Cenotaph, new outdoor gazebo for Australian Foundation for Disability, new storage facility for Hawkesbury Little Athletics Club and a new shade sail for Pitt Town Public School.

"This is fantastic news for Hawkesbury.

"This grassroots funding will directly help create a more vibrant and inclusive local community with positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes," Ms. Preston said.

"I congratulate all the organisations that were successful in their application and look forward to seeing how these projects make a real difference for community groups in the area."

The full list of successful projects in the Hawkesbury electorate for the 2019 round are:

- Pitt Town Progress Association Inc. - New toilet block at Bona Vista Park that consists of two unisex, disabled toilets, each with baby-changing facilities - \$80,000
- Hawkesbury City Little Athletics Centre Inc. - Extension of the building to include a large accessible equipment storage room - \$40,000
- Maroota P & C Association - Tennis court to be resurfaced and shade sail installed one end - \$35,000
- Catholic Parish of St Matthew Windsor - Remove existing Air Conditioning Plant and replace with three 34Kw Units - \$31,000
- Mahamevnawa Bhavana Monastery & Meditation Centre of Sydney - Renovation of the dining hall - \$25,000
- Pitt Town Public School P & C Association - Shade sail over playground equipment and soft fall for movable play equipment - \$20,000
- Glenorie Memorial Hall Committee Inc. - Erection of Glenorie Memorial Cenotaph safety barriers - \$20,000
- Anglican Church Property Trust Diocese of Sydney - Electrical rewiring of the church building and the installation of LED lighting throughout the building - \$15,000
- Australian Foundation for Disability - Construction of an outdoor gazebo including interactive sensory smart board and deep tissue massage chairs - \$11,240
- The Scouts Association of Australia NSW Branch - Renovate and build new hall/toilet block - \$8,500
- Trustees of Church Property for the Diocese of Newcastle - Building and construction of a new toilet facility - \$5,000
- The Friends of the Australiana Pioneer Village Society Inc. - A freestanding timber

- maze and children's playground item - \$4,760
- Windsor District Baptist Church - Construct and build a multi model train area that includes electronics, trains, signals etc. for community use - \$4,500

Now a decade old, the Community Building Partnership program has funded more than 13,800 community projects since it commenced in 2009.

Applications for the 2020 Program open in May.
