FUNDING ANNOUNCED – 2021 COMMUNITY BUILDING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

The electorate of Hawkesbury has today secured \$400,000 in funding for a total of 21 projects through the NSW Government's 2021 Community Building Partnership Program.

Member for Hawkesbury, Robyn Preston MP, said the State Government funds will deliver much-needed improvements to local facilities.

The Richmond Literary Institute is one of 21 worthy recipients of the CBP program who will be receiving \$16,000 for the refurbishment of the Archerfield Room at the Richmond School of Arts.

"The CBP Program funding has been a proven winner for the Hawkesbury community," Ms Preston said.

"This grassroots funding will directly help create a more vibrant and inclusive community with positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes.

"Congratulations to all the organisations that were successful in their applications and I look forward to seeing how these projects take shape and make a real difference for community groups in the area."

The Community Building Partnership program has funded more than 16,000 community projects since it commenced in 2009.

In 2022, there will be \$400,000 allocated to each electorate. Applications for the next round of grants in this Program open in early 2022.
