SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS PLANNED FOR BELLS LINE OF ROAD NORTH RICHMOND

Plans to improve safety along a 330 metre stretch of Bells Line of Road at North Richmond have been unveiled, with the public invited to submit feedback.

Member for Hawkesbury, Robyn Preston MP said the proposed upgrade, between Crooked Lane and Redbank Road, will see deeper shoulders, a wider centreline, a new safety barrier and road surface improvements.

"These upgrades will improve safety and assist traffic flow on a key bend on the Bells Line of Road near Kurmond," Ms Preston said.

"This work will complement a recent upgrade along the road to improve access to the nearby Colo High School.

"Subject to approvals, works are expected to commence in early 2023 and take around three months to complete."

The Australian Federal Government and the NSW Government are investing more than \$400 million to improve safety and reduce crashes on NSW roads.

The upgrade is one of a number of projects to improve safety and access along Bells Line of Road, which also includes work to upgrade the Richmond Bridge.
